### Genesis 1: High School Devotions

#### Day 1: Discovering the Creator

Scripture: Genesis 1:1 - "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth."

#### Devotional:

High school can feel like a whirlwind of new experiences and challenges. It's a time when you're learning more about who you are and what you believe. Genesis 1:1 is a powerful reminder that before anything else existed, God was there, creating everything.

Scripture: John 1:1-3 - "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God... All things were made through Him..."

## Devotional:

Schoolwork often involves studying different subjects and forming a comprehension and working through problems. Similarly, you need a foundation for your faith. John 1:1-3 connects Jesus as the living Word—the same Word through which everything was created.

The Bible isn't just an old book; it's a living guide that offers wisdom and direction for your life. Trust it as a reliable foundation. As you encounter challenges and questions about faith, lean into the truth that Jesus, the Word, is God and in the beginning, creating everything, including you.

## Reflection & Prayer:

Think about a time when reading the Bible helped you in a situation. How did it guide or comfort you? Spend some time today praying for a deeper hunger and love for God's Word. Ask Him to help you see its relevance in your daily life, especially in high school.

## Day 4: Science Meets Faith

Scripture: Hebrews 11:3 - "By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command..."

## Devotional:

Science classes might teach you a lot about how the world works, but Hebrews 11:3 reminds us that faith helps us understand why it all exists. The universe, in all its complexity, was formed by God's command.

## Day 5: Embracing Your God-Given Purpose

Scripture: Jeremiah 1:5 - "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart..."

## Devotional:

High school is a significant time for figuring out who you are and what you want to do. In Jeremiah 1:5, God tells Jeremiah that He knew him even before he was born and had set him apart for a purpose.

This means you were created with intention and love. God has a specific purpose and plan for your life that goes beyond high school. Trust that He is guiding you, even when the path seems unclear or challenging. Your identity and future are secure in Him.

## Reflection & Prayer:

Think about your dreams and goals for the future. How do you think these align with what God might have planned for you? Spend time praying for God's guidance and clarity as you navigate your high school years and future decisions. Ask Him to help you trust in His good plans.
