What insights can we gain from Matthew's Gospel about the relationship between faith, obedience, and the transforming work of God in a believer's life?

How does Matthew's emphasis on Jesus' teaching ministry challenge our approach to spiritual growth and the role of Scripture in the life of the church?

In what ways does Matthew's Great Commission (28:18-20) shape our understanding of the church's mission and our individual roles in fulfilling it?
