Matthew 2 Questions:

How does the concept of 'receiving the king' versus 'reacting to the king' apply to our own spiritual lives and responses to Jesus?

In what ways might we, like the Magi, need to lay aside our own priorities and preconceptions to truly worship Jesus?

How can we discern whether we are being led by the Holy Spirit or by our own desires and cultural influences?

What does it mean to have a 'real encounter' with Jesus, and how might that change our daily lives and relationships?

How does the contrast between Joseph's obedience and Herod's fear challenge us in our own responses to God's leading?

In what areas of our lives might we be resisting God's transformative work, similar to the religious leaders who knew scripture but didn't apply it?

How can we cultivate a spirit of immediate obedience to God's prompting, rather than delaying or rationalizing our response?

What might it look like in our modern context to 'present our treasures' to Jesus, as the Magi did?

How does the idea of Jesus as the 'branch' or 'shoot' from Nazareth inform our understanding of His mission and identity?

In what ways might God be calling us to wait patiently and prepare, even when we don't see immediate direction or results in our spiritual lives?
