

Matthew 3: 5-Day High School Devotions

Day 1: The Starting Point - Repentance

Scripture: Matthew 3:1-6

Devotional:

Hey there! We're diving into the story of John the Baptist in Matthew 3, where he talks about repentance. Think of repentance as turning around when you're going the wrong way. It's not just feeling sorry for something wrong you've done; it's making a conscious choice to change your direction and start doing what's right.

Reflection:

Scripture: Matthew 3:8

Reflection:

Scripture: Acts 1:8

God, help me to live by Your standards every day. Teach me through Your Word and help me to apply it in my life. Show me how to make the right choices and live in a way that honors You. Amen.
