I. Jesus and the Fulfillment of the Law (Matthew 5:17-20)

A. Jesus did not come to abolish but to fulfill the Law and the Prophets.

Cross-reference: Matthew 3:15 – Jesus fulfills all righteousness.

B. The permanence of the Law.

Cross-reference*: Psalm 119:89, 142 – The eternal and true nature of God's Word.


C. Requirement for righteousness greater than the Pharisees and scribes.

Cross-reference:

Romans 3:31 – Faith upholds the Law.

Philippians 3:6-9 – Righteousness through faith, not the Law.

II. Anger and Reconciliation (Matthew 5:21-26)

A. Internalizing the command against murder.


Cross-reference: 1 John 3:15 – Hatred is tantamount to murder.

B. Jesus' teaching on anger and insults.

Cross-reference: Ephesians 4:26-27 – Do not let the sun go down on your wrath.

C. The priority of reconciliation over ritual.

Cross-reference: Genesis 4:3-8 – Cain and Abel serves as a backdrop for understanding the dangers of unresolved anger.

III. Adultery and Lust (Matthew 5:27-30)

A. Extending the command against adultery to include lust.


Cross-reference:

Job 31:1 – Making a covenant with one's eyes to avoid lust.

James 1:14-15 – Sin begins with desire.

B. Radical measures for dealing with sin.

Cross-reference: 2 Timothy 2:22 – Fleeing youthful lusts.

IV. Divorce (Matthew 5:31-32)

A. Jesus' clarification on permissible grounds for divorce.

Cross-reference:

Malachi 2:16 – God hates divorce.


Matthew 19:3-9 – Jesus expounds on divorce and hardness of heart.

Deuteronomy 24:1-4 – The Law concerning divorce.

V. Oaths (Matthew 5:33-37)

A. Command to let 'yes' be 'yes' and 'no' be 'no'.

Cross-reference: James 5:12 – Let your “yes” be “yes” and your “no” be “no”.

VI. Retaliation (Matthew 5:38-42)


A. Redefining the principle of 'an eye for an eye'.

Cross-reference:

Exodus 21:24 – The Law limited retribution.

Romans 12:17-21 – Do not repay evil with evil.

B. Encouragement to turn the other cheek and go the extra mile.

Proverbs 20:22 – Wait on the Lord for justice.


VII. Love for Enemies (Matthew 5:43-48)

Luke 6:27-36 – Jesus' broader teaching on loving enemies.

Cross-reference:


1 John 4:7-8 – Love comes from God.


II. Anger and Reconciliation (Matthew 5:21-26)

- Radical action against sin.


Cross-references:

- Prohibition of swearing falsely.


Cross-references:
