

Day 1: Making Wise Choices Amid Temptations

Scripture: Genesis 6:1-3

Reflection:

Scripture: Genesis 6:9

Prayer:

Father, help me to walk faithfully with You, even when it means standing out. Give me the ability and courage to be righteous and blameless according to Your Word in my generation.

Application:

Identify one area where you feel pressured to conform. As you spend time in God's Word write down ways He speaks to you about how He desires to strengthen you so that you are able to stand firm in your faith. Ask a trusted friend or mentor to pray for you as you continue seeking God's Heart in His Word.



Day 3: Embracing God's Purpose for Your Life

Scripture: Genesis 6:18

Reflection:

God had a specific purpose for Noah, which involved saving his family and preserving life on earth. As a high school student, you might wonder what your purpose is. Remember that God has a unique plan for each of us, and He invites us to discover this by spending time with Him then being a part of His redemptive work.

Prayer:

Lord, show me Your purpose for my life. Help me to see how I can be a part of Your greater plan and live out my faith in practical ways.



Application:

Consider your talents and interests. How can the Lord strengthen you to use the gifts and talents He has given you to serve others and fulfill God's purpose of those gifts and His purpose for giving and equipping you with them? Write down one way you sense the Lord has directed to you to use His gifts to make an impact for Him in your school or community.



Day 4: The Power of Obedience to God

Scripture: Genesis 7:1

Reflection:

Noah's obedience to God's command is a powerful example for us. Sometimes, obedience might not make immediate sense, but it's essential for a life that honors God. Reflect on the areas in your life where God is calling you to obey, even if it's challenging.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, teach me to obey Your Word even when it's difficult or when I don't fully understand. Help me to trust in Your plan and follow Your commands.



Application:

Is there something God is asking you to do that you've been hesitant about? Take a step of faith today and commit to obeying God in this area. Share your decision with a friend or mentor for accountability and support.

Day 5: Finding Peace in God's Promises

Scripture: Numbers 6:24-26

Reflection:

God's blessings and promises are for you, even as you navigate the ups and downs of high school life. His promise of peace and protection is something you can rely on. Embrace His peace, especially during stressful times like exams or social challenges.



Prayer:

Lord, I thank You for Your promises. Bless me and keep me as I go through each day. Shine Your face upon me and give me Your peace in all circumstances.

Application:

During a quiet moment, meditate on Numbers 6:24-26. Let God's promise of peace settle in your heart. Write down any worries you have and pray over them, asking God to fill you with His peace.
